

CLOSEOUT OF M-91060026

On July 6, 1990, the Office of Inspector General received a communication from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for OIG information. This communication described an FBI inquiry that originated from the [REDACTED]. This document, dated April 18, 1990, described allegations of fraud and corrupt practices against the [REDACTED] (the subject) made by [REDACTED] (the complainant), a former [REDACTED]. The allegations against [REDACTED] stemmed from a declined proposal submitted by the complainant to NSF in 1979. The complainant made a variety of serious allegations against many other Federal and state officials, as well as faculty and officials [REDACTED]. On June 23, 1987, Assistant U.S. Attorney [REDACTED] reviewed the facts of this case and advised that it was her legal opinion that no fraud against the government had ever occurred concerning the [REDACTED] and the complainant's allegations and she therefore would decline prosecution in this matter. As a result of their inquiry, the FBI determined it would not conduct an investigation. This matter is now closed.
